

FLEET CAPTAIN SAIL

On May 16th seven BYC sailboats competed In the Bone Island Regatta race to Key West. This year for the first time the race had enough boats to have a Tampa Bay start in addition to the traditional start in Sarasota. Four boats raced in Spinnaker class, (Mischief, Windcaller, Special K and Crescendo) and three boats raced in True Cruisers class, (Seraphim, Marianna and Fog *Ducker*). Crescendo was the only Tampa Bay starter to finish the race since conditions were light and often on the nose. Most boats turned on the engines before the afternoon, Special K holding out until sunset Thursday and Windcaller around 3AM Friday. Windcaller crew member, Ryan McClash, caught a King Mackerel on the way down and had it for dinner and lunch the next day. While at Key West Windcaller sailed out to Sand Key and snorkeled.

Windcaller raced back in the Key West to Naples Race. After a great start, Windcaller averaged seven knots until 4PM when light winds came and stayed. They started the engine about dinner time and got to Naples at 8AM. Casev

and PC Joe McClash brought the boat back from Naples stopping at Cabbage Key, taking the swash channel out of Boca Grande and a stop-over at Sarasota Yacht Club.

After winning their class in the Bone Island race, *Crescendo* cruised to the Dry Tortugas then sailed to Marco Island and to Fort Myers
