Funds (except the Hurricane Fund and Basin RCIF). The total cost of the project is not to exceed \$990,000.


It will be launched with the installation of the temporary kitchen, refrigeration and storage trailers near the back door, during late April. In the meantime, detailed architectural and engineering drawings, equipment lists and permits will move forward to get construction started in early May.

While we envision a completion in Sept./ Oct., one never knows what surprises lay hidden beneath floors or in walls and ceilings.

The main aim of the project is to improve the quality, speed and enjoyment of the food service.

Among the many other benefits to come of this investment are increased personnel and fire safety, more meal variety, greater capacity, real pizza, better prime rib and, in general, a better club experience.

The kudos can wait until it's over and we see the results, but we wouldn't have gotten to this point with an efficient and affordable plan without the incredible focus and efforts of rear Commodore Bill Wheeler. 

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

Well, till next month, see you around the club and happy boating. Cheers. -Bobby



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

Treasurer's Report

MID YEAR FISCAL REPORT 2017/2018

I am pleased to report that our Club is doing well relative to this years operating plan, despite the unanticipated repair expenses emanating from Hurricane Irma. Also, the Club lost significant planned revenue, as the Florida Council of Yacht Clubs (FCYC) canceled its' annual meeting and banquet scheduled at the BYC that hurricane week end. Fortunately, FCYC weekend at the BYC has been rescheduled and we will host the event November 2-4, 2018.

Total operating revenue through six months is \$1,636,000 relative to a budget of \$1,541,000 and \$1,507,000 the prior year. Food, beverage, banquet and fuel sales were particularly strong drivers of this performance.

Expenses are in control, especially when calculated as a per cent of revenue. On a dollar basis we have had increases in kitchen and service staff salaries. This dollar increase is a direct result of higher food volume encumbered by a thirty year old, inadequate kitchen with unreliable equipment. Electricity expense has been running 23% ahead of budget all year. The mid 2017 increase from our utility provider was not expected, therefore not built into our plan. This will be an issue for the remainder of 2017/2018. Management is exploring opportunities to drive this cost down over the next six months.

The BYC Balance Sheet remains exceptionally strong when measured against Yacht and Golf clubs statewide. With substantial cash on the books and no debt, BYC is the envy of most Clubs in Florida and beyond.

I'd like to congratulate General Manager, George Gordon and his staff for their continuing, diligent efforts to elevate our BYC experience while maintaining control of expenses.

If more detail is required, that information is posted across from the Controller's office for all members to view. Respectfully submitted. – *Carl*




