Commodore Bill Wheeler, who has spent well over a year creating and managing the project, has finally retired. Again. Really. We mean it this time. Thanks, Bill!




As you may know, the board of directors recently authorized a

# NOAA Fisheries role in science and management of fisheries

Sean Meehan is the NOAA Fisheries Southeast Regional Office's Recreational Fishing Coordinator. He acts as a point of contact for the recreational anglers in the three regions covered by this office: Gulf of Mexico, the South Atlantic & the U.S. Caribbean. He was raised on fishing boats with his father who was a part time charter captain out of Jupiter inlet. Sean grew to work as a mate & fishermen through high school & college. Sean has been with NOAA for almost 18 years working with fisheries, coral & seagrass ecosystems, emergency response as well as a Unit Dive Safety Officer for the NOAA Diving program.

The Southeast Fisheries Science Center conducts multidisciplinary research to inform natural resource management in the Southeast U.S., including the U.S. Gulf of Mexico, Caribbean & South Atlantic. Our science is used by NOAA, Regional Fishery Management Councils, Interstate & International Fishery Commissions, & other Federal, state & local agencies to make informed management decisions to protect & conserve the living marine resources in the Southeastern U.S. & Atlantic high seas. We have 4 primary divisions conducting & supporting our science.

NOAA Fisheries Southeast relies on scientists & fishery managers working together to ensure sustainable fishing opportunities, protection for endangered species & marine mammals & the conservation of the habitat needed to support marine life. Our region includes the South Atlantic, Gulf of Mexico, & the Caribbean.


facility. We have

Michael Bodin was our guest speaker, and he gave us updates on 2018 Florida legislative session regarding anchoring and transient boaters in Florida waterways. His group, along with several others, have prevented wholesale changes that would not have allowed transient boaters to anchor in protected harbors.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission is announcing the first opportunity to apply for Derelict Vessel Removal Grant for the 2018/2019 fiscal year. You must apply by 5pm October 17. There is 1 million dollars budgeted for this year. The guidelines and application for this grant is available at DVGrant@MyFWC.com or contact Phil Horning at (850) 617-9540.

The US Coast Guard issued a Marine Safety Alert regarding LED navigation Lights, it seems that LED Navigation lights could cause problems with your VHF and AIS reception when antennas are close to the LED lights. If you are having reception problems since installing LED's they could be the source.

There is a new near real time weather reporting site on the Peace River. For those of you who travel on Charlotte Harbor, the sensors have been placed on Peace River Marker 4. Up until now there was only land based sensors; to access this go to www.boat2puntagorda.org and click "Real Time Weather".
