Although the red tide has played havoc with the Manatee River Pram Fleet's regatta schedule this fall, it was a welcome relief in more ways than one when some of our skippers were able to go to the Inland Lakes Championship that was held at Lake Eustis the last weekend in October. No red tide there.

Cooper Duquette captured the 17-boat Green Fleet in the International Optimist Dinghy class with 16 points, 12 ahead of the second place sailor as he won six of the 11 races over the two-day regatta. He placed second in two other races and took third in two more – a stellar performance to say the least.

Isaiah Jones wound up in a tie for seventh place with 79 points and won the tie-breaker because he placed second in the last race. Regina Rettig came in 10th with 93 points in the biggest fleet at the 13th annual event.

In the seven-boat O'pen BIC class, Manatee River Pram Fleet's Brodie Hausman won all but two of that group's 10 races to grab the first place trophy. Brodie's MRPF teammate, James Freund, was second.

Young sailors from Jacksonville's Florida Yacht Club, St. Augustine Yacht Club, Daytona Beach's Halifax Youth Sailing Association, the Tampa Yacht & Country Club, Tampa's Davis Island Yacht Club, Clermont Youth Sailing Association as well as the host Lake Eustis Sailing Club competed both days.

Because other youth sailing groups have been stymied by the red tide, Stephanie Webb is working on a one-day clinic and sail on a Collier County lake in January. Stephanie is US Sailing's regional training coordinator and secretary-treasurer for the Florida Sailing Association. She also helps her husband Ross run the Edison Sailing Center in Fort Myers.

The plan is to hold this event at Sugden Regional Park, which is south of Naples, just off of U.S. Highway 41 (also known as the Tamiami Trail). It is a relatively small lake - compared to Lake Eustis, for example - but it is a great venue with white beaches. It is where Collier County conducts a yearround sailing program as well as a summer learn to sail camp.

We instituted a special sailing session for our race team during the week and called it Windmill Wednesdays. We took some of our young skippers out in our fleet of Windmill class vessels. It went well but since we are back to Eastern Standard Time on Nov. 4, it is too dark to sail after school and we have put that program on the shelf until next spring.

Another new project was an inter-club sail with some sailors from the Englewood Sailing Association. It was to have been held Saturday, Nov. 17. Officials are hopeful that it will be successful enough for our skippers to venture down to Englewood some Saturday and try out some of vessels that ESA has and go sailing on Lemon Bay. Maybe in the future, we can include other venues.

Jabbo Gordon, an instructor trainer for US Sailing, conducted a 40-hour Level 1 course for prospective small boat instructors in Venice the first two weekends in November and nine candidates successfully completed the training. Additionally, he has scheduled another course here for Dec. 27-30. If anyone knows a person interested in gaining that certification, have them contact Jabbo at (423) 202-8007. - Lisa

#### PEPPERMINT **CANDY COCKTAIL**

6 oz. Hot Chocolate 1 oz. Peppermint Schnapps Top with whipped cream, red & green sprinkles or crushed peppermint candies

### KAHLUA CHOCOLATE CUPCAKE WITH SALTED CARAMEL BUTTERCREAM

#### FOR THE CAKE:

- <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> Cup All Purpose Flour
- 1/3 Cup Cocoa Powder
- ½ tsp. Baking Soda
- 1/2 tsp. Baking Powder
- 1/4 tsp. Salt
- 1 tsp. Espresso Coffee Powder
- 1/2 Cup Unsalted Butter (softened)
- ¾ Cup Granulated Sugar
- 2 Large Eggs
- 1/4 Cup Whole Milk
- 1/4 Cup Sour Cream
- 1 tsp Vanilla Extract
- ¼ Cup. Kahlua

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line a cupcake pan with liners. In a bowl sift together all dry ingredients (Flour, cocoa powder, baking soda, baking powder, salt, and espresso powder.) In a separate bowl whisk together, the butter and granulated sugar. Add the eggs, sour cream, milk, vanilla, and Kahlua. WHISK UNTIL SMOOTH!

Add the dry ingredients into the mix using a rubber spatula. DO NOT OVER MIX

Divide the batter evenly into the cupcake liners Bake for 18-20 minutes, or until done

#### FOR THE FROSTING:

- 1/2 Cup Unsalted Butter
- 1/2 Cup Salted Butter
- 1 TBSP. Vanilla Extract
- 6 Cups Powdered Sugar
- 1/2 Cup Salted Caramel
- In the mixer, using the paddle attachment
- whip butter on a medium speed
- Add the vanilla extract
- Slowly add the powdered sugar
- Add salted caramel and mix for 4 minutes



### FOR THE SALTED CARAMEL

- ¾ Cup Granulated Sugar
- 2 TBSP Water
- 1/2 Cup Heavy Cream Room Temperature
- 1/2 Cup of Cubed Unsalted Butter- Room Temperature
- 1/4 Cup Vanilla Extract
- 2 Tsp. Sea Salt

Add the sugar and water to a heavy bottom sauce pot, mix to combine and turn on medium heat Lift the pot and swirl, DO NOT MIX, cook until the sugar turns to and caramel color (maybe 10 minutes) Turn down to low heat and add butter and whisk until thoroughly combined. Then add heavy cream and whisk

until combined completely. Remove from heat and add vanilla and salt. Allow to cool completely before adding to butter cream

We are now approaching the transitional time of year when mangrove snapper begin to arrive in Tampa Bay and the Manatee River. Fishing the rockpiles at the Skyway and other areas of Tampa bay should prove productive for these fish. Bridge structure should also be productive. This time of year also begins the arrival of sheepshead, which can be found in similar structures and under many of the residential docks. The rock piles south of Egmont key also hold sheepshead. I use a piece of shrimp on a jig head, toss it under the dock, let it settle to the bottom, and twitch it once or twice. No bite, recast it to another area of the dock. Still no bite, move to the next dock. For the rockpiles at Egmont, I rig a hook under a float, cast it up current of the structure, and let it drift along the rockpiles to cover more water.

Trolling the edges of the Tampa

bay channels or drifting big baits over rock piles can yield keeper size Gag Grouper this time of year.
