



TIM ROCKLEIN Commodore

By the time you read this, our new Executive Chef, Brant Good, will be getting settled into our new kitchen. He comes to us from the prestigious Cat Cay Yacht Club in

the Bahamas, and took over culinary responsibilities at BYC on January 15th. His resume is very impressive and too long to repeat here, but highlights include: He was a Sous Chef at the age of 19; a Chef de Cuisine at 21; at 23 he was the youngest chef at any Mobil Four Star/AAA Four Diamond Restaurant in the U.S. And during his 10 years as Executive Chef at the highly prestigious Capital City Club in Atlanta he served 3 former U.S presidents. Having sampled some of his creations during the interview process, I can promise you he can really cook! (no pressure, Chef...)

The Chef -he's a Florida native- and his wife Cheryl are getting settled into the area and you will be seeing him making his "rounds" and introducing himself around the Club. Please welcome him.

The transition to a new chef has not been an easy one, and at times we've not performed as well as we should. That said, while the search for a new Executive Chef was ongoing, two of our kitchen staff, Kitchen Manager Kathy Jo Cole and Chef Frank Hagaman stepped up and did a terrific job carrying us through the two-month transition when we were "chef-less," at one point working over 90 hours each in one week. The Thanksgiving dinners and the New Years Eve party they put

on were two of the most popular events in our Club's history and received rave reviews. We owe Kathy Jo, Frank, and all the kitchen staff our thanks for a job very well done.

Some more good news, and it relates to our finances. First, a little background: At the beginning of each fiscal year (July 1 thru June 30) the board approves a budget that balances members' expectations against the realities of operating a "business" in a fiscally responsible manner. Historically, the Club has often operated "in the red" June thru December, sustaining losses (Alice, our Controller, calls it "Negative Cumulative Operating Income") of around \$20,000-\$30,000 the first half of each year. Those losses have been due to the lower Club usage we see in the Fall, before member participation and spending increase through the Holidays and winter months. Those losses are (usually) overcome by (positive) Cumulative Operating Income December thru June, and we end the fiscal year "in the black."

Here's the good news: Thru this December, we've not incurred any significant operating loss. While the final numbers are not yet in, it appears that we will essentially break even the first half of this year, and may well -barring any unforeseen circumstances- end the year on a positive financial note. Of course, we'll continue to strive to meet or exceed our members' expectations, while keeping our financial house in order.

As always, I look forward to seeing you around our Club. – Tim





FCYC

The FCYC met at St Petersburg Yacht Club January 11 and 12. The meeting was very informative; our guest speaker was Melanie Brown from Johnson and Blanton, the FCYC Lobbying Firm. There is a 19 page report on the FCYC website; click Government Affairs and you can read the whole report. Some of the highlights are:

Key West Ordinance banning sunscreens made with Oxebensone and Octinoxate. Those chemicals are killing the coral reefs and they are banning their use. This is also being done in Hawaii and almost all of the sunscreens are made with these chemicals. They are keeping an eye on this to see if it is going state wide.

Gov Ron Desantis asked for the resignation of all of the board members of the South Florida Water Management that have been very friendly with the sugar industry in Fl and they will be replaced with members that want to protect our waters.

Gov Desantis signed an executive order to spend 2.5 billon dollars over 4 years for Everglades restoration and protection.

Gov DeSantis is establishing a Blue Green Algae task force charged with expediting progress toward reducing the adverse impacts of Blue Green algae in our waters.

All of this and more on the first 4 days of his administration, there is a lot to read about as I stated above.

There is a new cruising log that is available for those who would like one. I will have copies made and available at the club.

This month twenty-four Navigators revisited St Augustine. The Navigator's very first excursion was three years ago to this wonderful and historical city.

We arrived in St Augustine in time for a private afternoon trolley tour. The driver was well informed on the highlights of the city. We had dinner at our hotel so we would not be delayed for our "Night of Lights" tour of the spectacular decorations. St Augustine requires all the local merchants to decorate their places with white lights for the Christmas holiday. In fact, if they don't participate, there is a fine to be paid. We were given special glasses upon arrival at the trolley which made the white lights appear as snowflakes. The entire city was lit up with the white lights. Absolutely

beautiful!

The next day
we visited the
Alligator Farm
and Zoological
Park. They exhibit
24 species of
crocodiles and
many alligators
(even Albino
alligators), birds,
lemurs and more!
They offer an

exciting show every hour. We watched them feed a snack to 250 alligators. The farm even has a zip line & aerial course, if you are adventurous! After having lunch, we went to see the St. Augustine Lighthouse and Maritime Museum. Some were brave and walked the 219 steps to have a breathtaking view of the city.

The trip continued the next day to include the Lightner Museum which originally was the Alcazar Hotel built by Henry M. Flagler (cofounder of Standard Oil). The hotel featured the largest indoor swimming pool at the time. In 1925, Otto Lightner began collecting possessions and purchasing items from estates during the 1930's. His collection outgrew his Chicago home and in 1948 he came across the Alcazar Hotel, which was in disrepair,



and brought all of his collections to St Augustine. The Alcazar Hotel became the Lightner Museum and after his death he bequeathed all to the people of St Augustine. After lunch we had a private tour of the magnificent Flagler College. The college is considered the second most beautiful college campus. Some of the highlights include the beautiful Tiffany glass windows in the huge dining room and the mosaic floor of the Rotunda which is made up of thousands of marble pieces placed in patterns and sanded smooth to create a polished floor. The college originally was the Ponce de Leon Hotel built in 1888 for the very wealthy.

We were not done yet! Even though the temperature was only 42 degrees outside, after dinner, we went on a private Harbor cruise to see the lights from the water. Thank goodness for the wool blankets and hot chocolate given to everyone so we could stay warm. Some of us even remembered to bring our special glasses!

We rediscovered the beauty and history of St Augustine thanks to Anita and Howie Stein. They planned the entire trip itinerary and they did a fabulous job! We all had a grand time!




The Children's Home of Tampa was also the recipient of a substantial financial donation as a result of an auction held at the event for marine



And speaking of magazines and the BYC, Christmas came a little early to the Bishop Sailing Center as Bob Murphy, chairman of the club's long-range planning committee, donated a large box of nautical magazines. We are building a lending library and also have some sailing books that are available.

A move is afoot to establish a Florida West Coast Youth Racing Series that will include our program as a stopover.

These involve one-day regattas where the costs are low, and the experience is high. The east coast has been conducting them for over a year now and has attracted 111 competitors from the Upper Keys to Daytona Beach. If we don't become involved this spring, we will shoot for a fall series.

If there are any ladies in our reading audience who are interested in forming a women's sailing group, please contact either Lisa Fath or Jabbo Gordon. A couple of representatives from the Luffin' Lassies are interested in starting an organization here as part of the Florida Women's Sailing Association (FWSA).

It is primarily on the gulf coast and they have some interesting nicknames such as the Salty Sisters of St. Petersburg, Dinghy Dames of Tampa's Davis Island Yacht Club, Mainsheet Mamas of the Tampa Yacht & Country Club and the Bitter Ends of Venice. The clubs have learning to sail classes, racing and plenty of social activities. They sail mostly in Optimists and Sunfish.

Another opportunity that we are hoping to start is a power boating class so that people can acquire Florida's safe boating card. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission has a book entitled "How to Boat Smart", which is 62 pages long and includes a 75-question certification exam. Most organizations that offer the course make it all discussion, but our policy is "you learn best by doing" and our classes would involve some water work on our coach boats. Let us know if you are interested.

Finally, our US Sailing Level 1 instructor course here in December was successful. Stay tuned. - *Lisa*

CRANBERRY ORANGEMUFFIN

- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup cranberries
- 1 egg
- 3/4 cup orange juice
- 1/4 cup melted coconut oil
- 1 teaspoon grated orange zest

Preheat oven to 400°. In a large bowl mix the flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. (Sift for better consistency). Stir in cranberries. In a small bowl, whisk egg, orange juice, melted coconut oil, and grated orange zest. Add wet mixture to dry ingredients; stir until well combined. Spray muffin tin or use liners and spoon mixture into tin until 3/4 full. Bake for 15-20 minutes until lightly browned. Remove and serve!
