In spite of the red tide and other complications, the Manatee River Pram Fleet had a pretty successful fall campaign and we are looking forward to an even better winter and spring.

Several of our junior skippers competed in the annual Sarasota Yacht Club's Invitational Regatta on Nov. 3, but unfortunately most of the results were lost for the second year in a row. However, our own James Freund sailed his O'pen BIC to first place in that class.

On Nov. 17, we had four sailors from the Englewood Sailing Association come for our first inter-club event. They sailed a BIC and a 420, two boats that they don't have, as well as a Sunfish. The group went to Shaw's Point and visited the Hernando DeSoto National Park for a picnic.

It was definitely a "learn and have fun" experience because the Sunfish was the only class boat they had skippered before. None of them had ever sailed on a river, let alone our Manatee River. We are in hopes that we can take a group of our recreational sailors down there in the spring and sample their Picos.

MRPF's Isaiah Jones placed second in the 38-boat Green Fleet (for first year competitors) at the annual Thanksgiving Regatta at Tampa's Davis Island Yacht Club. And Regina Rettig finished fifth in the twoday event. It was blowing 15 to 18 knots on Saturday and after three races, only 11 boats were left standing.

Regina, who likes heavy air, was leading after the first day with 10 points. Isaiah had a terrible first race and came in 19th, but he won the second race and was sixth in the third. Sunday brought much lighter

> winds – around five knots, gusting to six – and Isaiah scored in the top 10 in all four races.

Officials allowed a throw-out and Isaiah tossed that 19th place finish and moved up into second with 25 points. Regina, who is learning to deal with light air, slipped to fifth with 43 markers, only two out of fourth. Teams came from Clearwater, St. Petersburg and Venice.

Meanwhile, coaches Lisa Fath, Mike Crotty and Rob Woithe have been competing in various Windmill class regattas, first at Boca Ceiga Yacht Club in Gulfport, and then at the Tampa Sailing Squadron in Apollo Beach. James Freund, one of our junior skippers mentioned earlier, crewed for Lisa in Gulfport.

Looking ahead, MRPF sailors plan on attending the Gasparilla Regatta, hosted by the Tampa Yacht & Country Club, on Jan. 12-13. In February, many in our fleet will head for Key Largo where they will race in the annual Buccaneer Blast, which is hosted by the Upper Keys Sailing Club.

Our recreational fleet program has proven to be very successful. Our young skippers come to the Bishop Sailing Center on Sunday afternoons, when the weather is decent, and check out a boat. Some of them like to try a different class boat each week and that gives them even more experience on the water.

In the meantime, Jabbo Gordon continues to conduct US Sailing Level 1 (small boat) instructor courses. As of this publication's deadline, he had nine registered for a December course here, and six of them are from out of state. He also attended the annual meeting of the Florida Sailing Association at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club in December as well as a US Sailing regional symposium. Stay tuned- *Lisa*
