



Originally known as the Council of 13, its membership has since grown to 36 clubs statewide. Member clubs, primarily on the coasts, are available from Jacksonville to Pensacola. Membership in the organization is limited to bona fide, member-owned, nonprofit yacht clubs. The original burgee



was an Anchor centered in the middle with a #1 on the left and a # 3 on the right. The council still maintains a similarlooking patch worn by board and council members throughout the state.

libation at the bar in our club, pay special attention to the burgees surrounding the bar top. The original Council of 13 is represented and Bradenton Yacht Club was one of them. Since our inception dating back to 1946, BYC has been a substantial pioneer in the organization we now call the "Florida Council of Yacht Clubs."

Why is the game of Bridge called Bridge?

In my naivety, I had mistakenly thought the game of Bridge was aptly named in an effort to emphasize that it is primarily a partnership. A good assumption on my part, but far from the truth of the matter. And now the rest of the story follows: Why is the game of Bridge called Bridge?

The word Bridge is thought to have its origin in the Russian word Birtch dating back to the 1500 hundreds. The English translated Birtch into Whist from which the game of Bridge as we know it evolved into Bridge.

Bridge is touted to be all about playing cards strategically, but it is also a game that requires strict adherence to the rules of the game in order to communicate with a partner. Using the rules in a coded language helps facilitate one player taking as many tricks as possible. Intuitive bidding versus bidding calculated thorough the rules, with rare exception, is frowned upon by most advanced players. It is fundamental and expected that a partner will use the same coded language and not deviate from the accepted norm.


