

Hello and hope you all enjoyed the BYC over the summer. We are now approaching the fall/winter season, which tends to be our busiest time of the year. So, in preparation for the upcoming season, our annual shutdown will start Tuesday, September 2nd through Monday, September 8th, reopening on Tuesday, September 9th and resuming regular schedule. 



Research: Ocean Circulation Ocean-Atmosphere Interaction Studies in the Tropics; and West Florida Continental Shelf Circulation

Specialties: Physical Oceanography, Continental Shelf and Estuary Circulation Marine Observations and Modeling, Forensic Studies.

Applications to: Hurricane Storm Surge and Waves, Harmful Algal Blooms, Spill Tracking, Fish Recruitment and Location.

Dr. Weisberg authored a recently released book, Climate to a Fish Sandwich: Why We Study The Ocean's Circulation. The book addresses why just about everything that we experience on Earth depends upon the ocean circulation, the movement of the ocean water. Intended for a general audience, the book explains how the ocean circulation and the ocean's interactions with the atmosphere provides the basic underpinnings for global climate and ecology. It then launches into more specific topics of societal relevance (e.g. how the coastal ocean and estuaries work, sea level variations, ocean waves and extreme tsunamis, hurricane storm surge and wave damage, how ocean temperatures change seasonally, harmful algal blooms, alternative energy potential and fish recruitment). Whereas some of these applications have a Florida emphasis, all of them are equally applicable to coastal regions elsewhere.

Importantly, Bob is a St. Petersburg Yacht Club member and a sailor who had visited BYC prior to selling his Catalina 355. combined Power and Sail Fleet meeting.

The September 10th combined Sail and Power Fleet meeting will be a presentation by Robert Weisberg, Distinguished Professor Emeritus, College of Marine Science, University of South Florida. Bob is also a St. Petersburg Yacht Club member and a sailor who visited BYC in past days when he had his Catalina 355. The presentation title is that of his recently released book, Climate to a Fish Sandwich: Why We Study the Ocean's Circulation. Dr. Weisberg, a physical oceanographer, arrived at USF in 1984 as Associate Professor engaged in ocean circulation and ocean-atmosphere interaction studies in the tropics, on continental shelves, and in estuaries. Recent research emphasis is the West Florida Continental Shelf (WFS) and the interactions that occur between the shelf and the deep ocean and between the shelf and the estuaries. The knowledge derived from his published studies is extremely relevant to coastal Florida with applications including harmful algal blooms, fisheries, storm surge and waves, tropical storm models, tracking of harmful substance spills and forensic studies.

The BYC Kick-Off Regatta is scheduled for September 26-28, 2025 and preparation is well underway. The BYC Kick-Off Regatta, as one would suspect from its title, ushers in the West Florida sailing regatta season and is on the Boat of The Year Schedule (BOTY). This major West Florida sailing event could not happen without the help of many BYC volunteers and staff. Included is the list of the usual suspects, Bob Armstrong, who is current president of West Florida PHRF this year along with Fred Ruggiero, the perennial, in the know, git'er done sailor. And of Course, BYC staff Jenifer Gordon, Kathy Jo Kinsey and others who make these events happen without wailing and gnashing of teeth.

I hope to see you at the combined Power and Sail Fleets' season opener with guest speaker Robert Weisberg. It's a don't miss event! – *John*

Dare I say it: we are entering peak season for "that time of year" again. No worries however, as I am knocking on wood! Seriously though, as boaters we need to be especially vigilant in this part of the season. Many of you have heard our story about the transportation of our 40' SeaRay from Boston to Palmetto last August, just in time to be greeted by 3 "unwanted visitors" named Debby, Helene, and Milton. What a "welcome" to Florida! You all know best how to prep your own boats for these storms, so I won't go there. But as I reflected on last year's "visitors," there were some things I learned and vowed to do differently next time.

- 1. Batten down the hatches! So obvious right? But we never use our hatches, and they were fine during Helene. But somehow Milton's higher winds got under one hatch, flipped it open and smashed it to pieces on the deck. Ugh. Turns out a tech working on our boat had opened that hatch one day and not latched it shut. And I never checked it. This season besides latching /locking them, I'll tape down the hatches on the outside for extra peace of mind.
- 2. Dock lines stretch especially when rain-soaked, in high winds, and with a heavy boat. Of course, I already knew this. I doubled-up my hefty braided dock lines and left over 2 feet between the swim platform and head dock. But after the storm, I was sure surprised to see that our boat was almost a foot closer to the head dock. Wow!

- 3. Check your neighbor's boat for anything that might fly loose and damage your boat. Also consider adding your old dock lines to the boat next to yours so it stays put. During Helene, our neighbor's 40' boat had its swim platform ripped off, and no one knew where that platform went --near or under our boat maybe? I could have just added another spring line to his boat and spared us both the trouble.
- 4. Add a wi-fi camera to your boat. This way you can see what's happening in real time and maybe learn how to do something better for next time!

What did you learn last year? Hopefully, we won't need any of these tips any time soon!


Calling All James Bond Fans




