We would like to have a Sail-a-thon, similar to one in Indian Rocks, where sailors register by bringing cans of food, which in turn are donated to a local food bank. WHITE LASAGNA RECIPE

INGREDIENTS

9 Lasagna noodles 1 c. Grated Parmesan Cheese 1⁄2 c. Butter 1 tsp. Dried Basil 1 Onion, Chopped 1 tsp. Dried Oregano 1 Garlic Clove, Minced 1⁄2 tsp. Ground Pepper 1⁄2 c. Flour 2 c. Ricotta 1 tsp. Salt



2 c. Diced cooked chicken 2 c. Chicken Broth ½ bag spinach 1 ½ c. Milk 4 c. Shredded Mozzarella

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F

Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook lasagna noodles in boiling water for 8 to 10 minutes. Drain, and rinse with cold water.

Melt the butter in a large saucepan over medium heat. Cook the onion and garlic in the butter until tender. Stir in the flour and salt, and simmer until bubbly. Mix in the broth and milk, and boil, stirring constantly, for 1 minute. Stir in 2 cups mozzarella cheese and 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, season to taste with the basil and oregano. Remove from heat, and set aside.

Spread 1/3 of the sauce mixture in the bottom of a 9x13 inch baking dish. Layer with 1/3 of the noodles, ricotta cheese and chicken. Arrange 1/3 of the noodles over the chicken, and layer with 1/3 of the sauce mixture, spinach, and the remaining 2 cups mozzarella cheese and 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese. Arrange remaining noodles over cheese, and spread remaining sauce evenly over noodles. Sprinkle with parsley and 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese.

Bake for 40 Minutes. Enjoy!

This is the first time I have had the chance to write about the past fiscal year. I want to inform you, what a successful year we had. Our total membership at the end of the year, which was June 30, 2018, was 654 total all – we almost made it to the magic number of 650 total voting members. The New Year has come and as expected, we have had members resign with reasons of: lifestyle change, health issues, moving out of state and job changes. In speaking with Jenifer, BYC Membership & Marketing she mentioned, the majority of the members that resigned, were reluctant and very emotional with their decision to leave BYC and said "we will be back!" So, it was nothing we did. We already had one reinstate and it was only one month.

But—to have been that close to reaching cap, your Membership committee made sure we had a wait list procedure ready and with Board approval, the procedure has been implemented into the rules. (Up to date BYC Bylaws and Rules can be viewed on the BYC Website under Member Central) The Rules read: At any point when the membership reaches the Bylaw prescribed limit, a waitlist shall be started. After the applicant is approved through the normal membership process, a \$500 refundable deposit will be required and the proposed applicant will be added to the waitlist. They will still be able to come to the complimentary promotional pasta night, enjoy their 30 day free promotional membership, while they wait for an opening. The one thing we want to make sure is that the BYC experience is always members first. Wait lists are not new to the club, how many have had to wait for a slip, and usually it opens because someone got a bigger boat.

Membership is truly making some changes which the Board approved at their August meeting. As proposed, all starting October 1, 2018; the promotional trial membership period will go from 60 days to 30 days. We find most people know they love us in the first few minutes and if they don't well they don't need the other 30 days. We are increasing the initiation fee from \$3750 to \$4290 and we are lowering the cap number to 625 total voting members, yes, we want you to be able to have a seat and parking spot. We are also changing the reinstate fee to 10% of the prevailing initiation fee at time of reinstatement.

Isn't it exciting to think of the trailers vanishing and when we get back from the August shut down the new kitchen will be open. I know you are all waiting for this and I know our staff is even more thankful. Remember to give them an extra thank you for their heroic work during the kitchen renovation.

On September 28th at 6 pm we are hosting a Potential New Member Mixer for our Fall into Season Membership Drive for promotional/member prospects. Our best source of referrals are YOU, so introduce your friends and family, bring them to the club for a fun casual evening of introduction on September 28th where we will invite them to our Free 30 Day Trial Membership. We are open for business, Ready for Season and would love to have them join us and be part of the amazing memories we are creating here. Our gift to you, the sponsoring member, if you bring in a friend who joins, you will receive \$100 in (4) \$25 beverage/bar gift certificates to "Have a Drink On Us!" So..... As you have just read, regarding all the upcoming changes, October 1 isn't far away, you really do need to get on the phone, text them, email them and tell your friends and family who have been saying they would love to join. NOW IS THE TIME.

Membership Committee is a really active committee and we are always looking for new people to join us, we meet the first Tuesday of the month at 5:30 pm. You don't have to do anything but show up and try us out. If you are a new member, enrich your membership by joining a committee or club within the club, you will find that you really will meet more people and feel like you are a part of the BYC family. Plus, we need you, our committee members are so good they keep moving up and taking board positions.

We spent the month of July this year with our daughter, son in-law, and granddaughter in the Northeast, and while there we visited a couple of yacht clubs. One of the local yacht clubs is the Volunteer Yacht Club in Lynn, Massachusetts.

Lynn is a blue collar community about half way between Boston, to the south, and Gloucester to the north. Lynn Harbor is well protected, being tucked between the mainland on one side, and to the east, Little Nahant and Nahant, which were islands until a causeway was built to connect them to the mainland. The causeway and the Nahants protrude a little over three miles into Broad Sound providing the VYC with good protection from the north. The Lynn Volunteer Yacht Club, established in 1870, is a nondescript, two story building with a large deck looking out over the water. The second floor of the building is lined on one side by a bar with a small kitchen behind it, and the remaining space has cafeteria tables and chairs. A pool table in a far corner fills the rest of the upstairs area. The wall facing the water and overlooking the docks is sliding glass doors leading out to the deck. The members have recently gutted and rebuilt both restrooms, which were very nicely finished. They have a walk ramp that leads from the building down to floating docks which have approximately 50 slips. In addition, VYC has about 18 moorings between the docks and the channel. The VYC has a boat ramp on its west side and a yard where vessels remain for the winter on the north side of the building. The VYC owns, and a select group of trained members operate, a crane to lift vessels in and out of the water.

The Volunteer Yacht Club operates in a unique fashion. The VYC is operated and maintained by the members, and part of the "cost" of joining is that one must spend a set number of hours working at the club performing repairs, improvements, working in the bar/kitchen. Once a member of the VYC, the members each continue to perform all operational functions including repairs, maintenance, bookkeeping, billing... The only outside help are folks that cook and tend bar. So the first time I saw folks carrying tools and supplies around the club, I did not realize they were all members.

slips are filled almost exclusively with power boats of varying sizes from 16' to mid 40's. Although fishing is the primary activity for the members, I did meet a gentleman who was on his sailboat in his slip and commented to him that, "You are pretty much out numbered". He smiled and we talked about his old, and well used boat. As we walked away my friend told me that he is 89 years old and still goes out, however, a member always goes with him. You quickly see that the VYC is truly a family. As I spend time at the VYC, I was constantly introduced to folks that have known each other since childhood. They all knew each other's families, extended families, and pretty much their family history.

We have known about the VYC for several years but had not been there until this year. At an annual Forth of July party which we have attended for the last few years, the father of the host was talking about his boat, saying that they had not been using it due to problems with the electrical system. The two newer 150 HP outboards worked perfectly, however, nothing else did. Not one single light, not either of the two bilge pumps, no horn, no macerator pump, no fuel gauge... nothing. After listening to the conversation for a while. It sounded like they were in over their heads and I volunteered to look at the boat's electrical system. This ended up being a two day complete rewiring of the electrical system of his 25' Grady White.
